The only philosophical work to his name – a testament to his potential and talent – displays an impassioned and poetic fragmentation without foregoing structural ambition.

A tribute to deception that is both a vibrant ode to authenticity and a critique of the impoverished spirit of the time that would eventually condemn him to death with cold and administrative efficiency. The recovery of this classic in Catalan philosophy restores, in part, the author's memory and the tradition of a radically free line of thought. A 1920's philosophical manifesto and a classic in Catalan thought that has only just now been recovered, both an invitation to leading a genuine life and a warning to a society on the brink of sinking to the depths of its own truths.



Josep Torres Tribó (Mollerussa, 1899 – Alkoven, 1941) was a libertarian teacher, philosopher, and intellectual. From a young age, he was a prominent anarchist. During the Spanish Civil War, he took part in the collectivisation of Catalan farmlands. After the war, he fled into exile in France where he was forced to enlist in the Company of Foreign Workers. In 1940, the Nazis

arrested him and made him a prisoner in the Mauthausen concentration camp. He was murdered in a gas chamber at the Hartheim castle in Alkoven, Austria, on September 22, 1941.

But what should have been the happiest of days, marked the beginning of a frightening journey to save her own life: to overcome insanity and regain her rationality; to take care of her new-born twins; to represent with dignity those who voted for her.

During her healing process, she realises that her most intimate struggles are a secret out in the open shared by many others before her. Centuries of whispering and gossiping silenced the lives of damaged women and labelled them as witches, hysterical wives, or any other of the volatile characterisations made of the female mind. Reaching out to art, literature, mythology, and medicine, Mar García frames her own story within a longer history of oppressed women seeking to deconstruct the myths of patriarchy. A personal and literary exploration on motherhood, insanity, and how women's greatest loves and deepest wounds have been silenced throughout history.





In this personal book, philosopher Marina Garcés gathers a series of writings, in which she pays homage to and dialogues with classical and contemporary figures that have influenced her work. Thinking *about* also implies thinking *with* (others), and, in a way, Garcés and her (bad) company have produced a synergistic book about freedom and truth.

In these pages, Büchner presents us Danton and Robespierre chatting in front of the gallows; Diderot and Sophie Volland describe their love in a hollow eternity; Saint Teresa chops onions while talking to her inquisitor; and Albert Camus discusses deception... An engaging compendium that displays the bounds of knowledge, care, and generosity embedded in Garcés' ruminations. Marina Garcés has somehow connected with the spirit of our times and has brought philosophy books -rigorous and beautifully written essays- back to the bestselling lists.



Marina Garcés (Barcelona, 1973) is a philosopher, activist, and teacher. Her work focuses on politics, critical thinking, and pedagogy. She is the author of several philosophy essays appealing to commitment and action. She oversees and teaches the master's on Philosophy for Contemporary Challenges at the Open University of Catalonia and runs the School of Thought of the Lliure Theater with Albert Lladó. She contributes to TV and radio shows. She has been a member of the academic board of the Independent Studies Program of the Museum of Contemporary Art of Barcelona (MACBA).

Txell Feixas had witnessed the first steps of the team and had been following their progress for over a decade when she returned to the court to meet Majdi and the players.

Written in short chapters and an engaging narrative style, the coach, the girls, their parents and families, and their endangered environment all have the chance to explain the story in their own words. In the end, this journalistic chronicle offers a detailed insight into life and death in the camp as well as how new generations of women there (and across the Middle East) can survive thanks to their sisterhood and heaps of courage. The story of the Shatila Refugee Camp girls' basketball team: the struggles, challenges, and battles both lost and won of a group of girls who defy the rules of the game.



Txell Feixas (Mediona, 1979) is a journalist. She has worked as a Middle East correspondent from Beirut for the Catalan Corporation of Audiovisual Media. She has covered the war against the Islamic State in Iraq, the collapse of the Caliphate from Rojava, and the Great March of Return demonstrations in Gaza. Before, she also covered the al-Qaeda kidnapping of the Barcelona Solidarity Action voluntaries in Mauritania and the

humanitarian crisis at the Ceuta-Morocco border fence. In her previous book *Brave Women*, she shed light on the struggles of women in Middle East conflicts.

It is also quite difficult to write a book about one of the most influential and quoted thinkers of the past decades. Fina Birulés, a world authority –an Arendtian concept in itself– on her fellow philosopher, succeeds in both endeavours with a personal approach to Arendt's work and uncovers new and illuminating threads of thought.

Birulés chooses two recurring categories in the work of this German-Jewish philosopher -the world and natality- to explain her thinking and how it is still relevant today. She speaks of tradition, beginnings, community, distance, freedom, memory, education, creating meaning, understanding, and responsibility. Under the attentive gaze of Hannah Arendt, this essay reveals that what is truly at stake is the very world itself.

The renowned expert Fina Birulés offers an original and refreshing approach to Arendt's work that goes beyond clichés and is deeply rooted in our current (dark) times.



Fina Birulés (Girona, 1956) is a philosopher. She taught Contemporary Philosophy at the University of Barcelona between 1979 and 2020. She is a researcher in the Philosophy and Gender-ADHUC Seminar which she helped to create in 1990. She is the author of articles and essays on subjectivity, politics and memory, feminist theory issues, and women's philosophy production, focusing on the thinking of Hannah Arendt. She has translated works of contemporary philosophy and has jointly published collective books on Simone Weil, Hannah Arendt, and Judith Butler.



Anna Pazos' writing is sharp and defiant, sceptical and distant. A gaze in open revolt that transforms her insatiable appetite for experience-hoarding into literature. In the end, perhaps literature was always the answer and writing down her life, the only way to redeem it. website. In 2020 she presented her first autobiographic short film, *The Circle*. In 2021 she produced *The Lost*, a non-fiction podcast on the stolen babies in Spain. Since May 2020 she is the cohost of the *Les Golfes* podcast.



Pilar Codony reviews Judeo-Christian tradition, the modern heteropatriarchy, and the climate crisis; Víctor Pérez digs into topics as wide and diverse as scapegoating in contemporary societies to pornography; Anna Pazos analyses the relationship between power and desire, the masculine and feminine eros; while Borja Bagunyà analyses the relationship between reality and consciousness as well as the implications behind the mechanisms of ordergiving and taking. Taking the confluence between scientific understanding (psychology, neuroscience, sociology of new technologies) and humanism (Tolkien's literary landscape, Rilke's poetic intuition, Hannah Arendt's essays, Agamben's philosophy) *Technology and Totalitarianism* examines and confronts proposals that seek to reduce human beings to data and algorithms, while preparing us to wilfully accept a new order of technocratic control.

A humanist counterweight to technocapitalism; an analysis of the perils of digital panopticism; a vindication of a life that transcends logical algorithms.



Jordi Pigem (Barcelona, 1964) is a Doctor of Philosophy. Between 1998 and 2003, he was a lecturer in the master's course in Holistic Science at Schumacher College (UK). He has also been a resident lecturer at the University of Barcelona and taught at several other universities, including Columbia and Oxford. In 1999, he was awarded the Institut d'Estudis Catalans Philosophy Award. He writes regularly for publications in Spanish,



The story filled newspapers' pages for months and inspired a whole array of theories and rumours. However, the case was eventually covered up without the truth ever surfacing. Irregularities around the investigation exposed the level of censorship imposed during the dictatorship and the lack of accountability of the governing elites.

Josep Sala Cullell has meticulously scoured newspapers and archive documentation from the time to make a colourful narrative reconstructing the events as well as to transport us to a thrilling and turbulent decade: a Barcelona filled with cabarets and pistolwielders, nightclubs, and hideouts where the bourgeoisie, unionists, artists, criminals, politicians, and journalists, hot on the scent for the story of the decade, all once mixed.

This is a crime chronicle and a historical fresco, a homage to the victims' memories, a critique of power, and a vindication of the importance – and fragility – of freedom of the press.

A piece of journalistic investigation that reopens a mythical case from Barcelona's darkest chronicles while offering a vivid depiction of life in the city in the 1920's.



Josep Sala Cullell (Girona, 1978) holds a degree in Environmental Sciences and Humanities. For years he has been living between Norway, where he is a high school teacher, and l'Empordà in Catalonia. He writes opinion articles for the online newspaper *Vilaweb*. In 2020 he published an essay addressing the question of the generational struggle for power, *Plug Generation*.

HISTORY

First launched in 2007, when Catalan Culture was Guest of Honor at the Frankfurt Book Fair, the project was designed to foster the translation of Catalan works into other languages and the introduction of these books to new markets. Since then, over 200 professionals from 45 countries have participated in this fellowship.

GOAL

The program aims to provide participants with a more in-depth perspective on Catalan literature and the Catalan publishing sector and to build networks among Catalan and international publishing houses and literary agencies.
