

CITY OF BARCELONA PRIZE FOR LITERATURE IN CATALAN 2024 This book is both homage to and exploration of the mystery that is language; a linguistic journey expressed through a father figure, who after suffering a stroke, was left without speech. He then set out on a hike along towering mountains in order to try and regain his ability to talk. In fewer than a hundred pages, they revisit the highest peaks of his life, the lowest pits of his stroke, and follow the torturous paths of his brain along which whole lives can be led astray.

"Marxarons" is a verb which does not exist in any language; it is an expression of mental despair, the only word the author's father could utter and a symbol of both his inability and impulse to communicate. What cohesion can a subject have if it lacks a grammar? Under which neuronal fold do our identities hide? How is consciousness built without speech?

Here is an emotive book that, while eschewing sentimentalism, narrates with precision and elegance the rise of a literary truth in a place where meaning has perished.

She contributes opinion pieces, articles on art and historical commentaries to a variety of publications, and sits on the editorial board of L'Avenç. She is the author

of two acclaimed biographical essays: *Lídia de Cadaqués* (Quaderns Crema, 2001) and *Germaine Gargallo* (Llibres del Segle, 2014). She also published *Eroica* (2021), a lockdown diary delving into a traumatic episode in her family's past, with *L'Avenç*.

Here is a book, or toolbox, to help us reflect on our humanistic tradition, modernity's crisis, and our current apocalyptic climate experiences. From its title onwards, his essay is full of tension points -ancient/modern, tradition/creation, magic/ science, sacred/profane- capsizing logic and offering unexpected harmonies between opposites. The work's central theme lies in the relationship between religion and art; firstly in a context of secularization; and secondly, in one of helplessness. As for the book's subtitle, it pertains to a discourse linking Ramon Llull (13th century) with Tapies (20th century) along a chain of Catalan and European Kabbalists, mystics, artists, musicians, poets, and thinkers in a veritable polyphonic display of ideas.

The author's precise and elegant prose, however, transcends both theme and subtitle. Garrigasait has the ability to take just about any object of study as a summary and symbol of a dynamic totality; whether it be a passage from the Old Testament, a biography of Christ written in the 15th century, the Faustian myth, a piano piece, or an abstract 20th century painting, anything starting point is a valid one when unravelling the world's inexhaustible relationships in a veritable celebration of intelligence.

Here is an essay connecting the Kabbalah to 20th century avant-gardists; an exploration of the correspondence between art and religion, while welcoming the tension between tradition and creation in order to continue pondering over the wonder that is the world.

Raül Garrigasait (Solsona, 1979) is a classicist, a translator from Greek and German, and author of essays, poetry and fiction. He holds a PhD in Classical Philology and teaches at the University of Barcelona. He presently heads La Casa dels Clàssics (The House of Classics), a project that works to popularise the universal classics. He has also translated into Catalan authors including Plato, Goethe, Rudolf Otto, Joseph Roth,

and Peter Sloterdijk. His novel *The Others* won several accolades, including the 2017 Catalan Booksellers' Prize and the Òmnium Award for Best Catalan Novel; he published another work of fiction in 2023, *Prophecy*. Some of his acclaimed essays are *The Cosmopolitan Dog and Two Other Specimens* (A Contra Vent, 2012), in which he explores such issues as cosmopolitanism; *The Fugitive Who Doesn't Go Away* (Edicions de 1984, 2018), about Santiago Rusiñol and the beginnings of modernity in Catalonia; and the brief essay, *Wrath* (Fragmenta, 2020).

Metaphors have the capacity to raise and sink horizons of possibility; these rhetorical figures of speech not only put a limit on what we consider to be natural, but also what we imagine to be possible or advisable. We live amongst the ruins of imagery which has long lost its poetic fulgor and now wanders the Earth scoring the ground with the weight of its own literalism. In this essay, Puig combines personal memoires, literary references (Homer, Shakespeare or Charlotte Gilman), pop imagery (from psychophonies to Mickey Mouse), philosophical studies (Freud. Austin and, in particular, Mark Johnson and George Lakoff) to elucidate on how centuries of metaphors have generated coordinates of the senses which direct our experiences and our way of conceiving the world. And, lo and behold, these are centuries of metaphors which respond to a heteropatriarchal, eurocentric and classist order.

Mar García Puig puts pen to page again with a critical study divulging the interests and arbitrary nature behind poetic conventions all while championing intuitions, sensitivities, and ways of being which the world of metaphors has penalised and relegated to the margins of history.

An intimate, narrational, and evocative essay that reflects on centuries of heteropatriarchal, eurocentric, and classist metaphors which have relegated collectives and sensitivities to the darker corners of existence. We must, therefore, champion that deep darkness of ours.

Mar García Puig (Barcelona, 1977) has a degree in English Language and Literature and a master's in Linguistics. An editor by profession, she has contributed articles to various national publications and participated in several collective works, namely LGTBI (Sembra Llibres, 2020), Neooldfashioneds. On the Dangers of Nostalgia (Península, 2022) and More Than Visible (Egales, 2022). Between 2016 and 2023, she

was a member of the Spanish Parliament and served as spokesperson for its Culture Committee. Her first solo work, *La història dels vertebrats* (PRH, 2023), was met with success and translated into Spanish, French, English, and Brazilian Portuguese.

paula@indentagency.com Indent Agency During the pandemic reality shifting became popular, a practice leading thousands of young people to move their lives into parallel realities, more or less inspired by fictional universes - such as Harry Potter, Narnia, or Marvel - where they enjoyed a custom-made identity and would interact for hours, days, or months with their idols and characters. This pop simplified version of quantic physics, our author argues, redefined in entertainment products and mystified by general sources of information, offers a pseudoscientific basis for these shifters. The book understands these issues as symptoms of and a way to analyse modern day woes; the spectral and liminal nature of reality; constant technological mediation; the malleability of identities; the emergence of digital communities which transcend political, cultural, and geographical divisions; transformations in modern day experiences of space and time; the feeling that hope has moved on to parallel universes and that redemption is no longer possible in this world of ours. A surprising essay that reveals a kaleidoscopic view of reality.

Here is an original and revealing essay that takes the phenomenon of reality shifting and the pop approach to quantum physics as a symptom of a spectral era in which redemption only seems attainable in parallel universes.

Gabriel Ventura (Granollers, 1988) is a poet whose work extends into other disciplines, including performance and film. He frequently collaborates with artist Rosa Tharrats, with whom he has co-directed several short films. He has received the Montserrat Roig grant and participated in various literary residencies, including the Finestres Residency. His work has been presented at venues and

festivals such as Fundació Brossa, Bombon Projects, Museu Tàpies, Festival Eñe, Festival Veu, Barcelona Poesia and Festival Poesia i +. His poetry has been translated into English, French, Greek, Dutch, Turkish, and Portuguese.

Ever since, the aspiration for the good life and friendship as a virtuous form of relationship have jointly created a tradition which continues today in series, cinema, and self-help guides alike: Gilgamesh, Aristotle, Montaigne, Simone Weil, Steven Spielberg or even Facebook likes have historically contributed to defining an authentic model of friendship. This book sets out on a suspicion: what lingers behind this ideal? How has it managed to remain stable for all this time? To whom is it addressed and who is left out? Can it help us to understand the meaning, pain, and fears that cross our relationships?

In fact, friendship is the sole stable social bond for which no institution has been created. There are no registration forms, nor do we sign any laws or contracts in order to be friends. Friendship resists descriptions, protocols, and attempts to control it; it is tangent of freedom which opens up an undefined space. Marina Garcés, the most read and globally translated philosopher writing in Catalan, explores the nature of friendship and sketches out a possible counter-definition: the passion of strangers.

Marina Garcés questions the model of friendship defined by the centuries (from Gilgamesh's epic poem to virtual interactions on social platforms) as a way to argue a counter-definition which respects the mystery and freedom behind the ungovernable passion between strangers.

Marina Garcés (Barcelona, 1973) is a philosopher, activist, teacher and author of several books including New Radical Enlightenment (which received the City of Barcelona Essay Prize). She is a lecturer at the Universitat Oberta de Catalunya (UOC) and is engaged in collective educational, cultural and social experimentation projects. She is also a leading member of the critical thinking group Espai en Blanc. Her work has been translated into ten languages.

4227 is the number of suicides recorded in Spain last year. A figure which continues to climb and a reality which tends to be silenced. It has been argued that, while we should avoid alarmism, it is evident that horror and stigma work in the system's interests. By considering suicide as a question of mental health, we end up negating any implicit social critique. Our author reminds us that psychiatry's origins lie in the courts, not in medicine, and that depression and anxiety have a political edge to them. These apparent mental illnesses are part and parcel of structural failures, transcending clinics and pointing towards a malaise in the different lifestyles proposed by capitalism.

This essay proposes an affective turn, drawing on our emotions to communicate critique: depression and melancholy as forms of resistance understood as emancipatory forms of negativity; versus desire understood as an insatiable source of positivity which enslaves individuals in a form of self-imposed exploitation, bound to algorithms, pharmaceuticals, the free market, and chatbots. The alternative is not any nostalgia felt for the past, nor a return to some utopian idea of modern progress, but rather a melancholic militancy engaging with the present.

Laura Llevadot converses with Benjamin, Foucault, Land, Berardi, Fisher, and Lacan while joining their ideas with Godard, Lars von Trier, the punk movement, Kurt Cobain, Burial, or Rosalía to articulate a theory on melancholy, a criticism of the contemporary subject's desire, and a vindication of the political critique arising from these 4227 non-exemplary suicides.

Laura Llevadot (Barcelona, 1970) is a senior lecturer of Contemporary Philosophy at the University of Barcelona. Her research focuses on contemporary thought, particularly French poststructuralism, with a strong emphasis on figures such as Jacques Derrida and Søren Kierkegaard. She founded and directed the first two iterations of the Barcelona Pensa Philosophy Festival

and led the *Pensament Polític Postfundacional* essay series at Gedisa, for which she wrote the volume 'Jacques Derrida: Democràcia i sobirania' (2019).

Montse Ingla montse.ingla@gmail.com Maria Nadal mnadal@arcadia-editorial.com Arcàdia Our author strikes a dialogue between classic and contemporary authors (La Boétie, McLuhan, Mauss, Simmel, Marcuse, Kracauer, Deleuze, Guattari, Bifo Bifardi or Mark fisher, to name but a few) revealing an exhaustive bibliographical knowledge as well as an understanding of the ills of our times, one in which digital spaces condition our access to the world and saturate our attention. An ambitious work that provides a two-part analysis exploring the shadows of this global panopticon we live under.

In the first part, Guardiola centres her work on questions affecting the public sphere: the politics and sociology of these digital capitalisms (exploitation of intimacy or the voluntary datafication of our lives; manufacturing social consent; the creation of political exceptionalism; bureaucratic protocols' stranglehold; technology in service to social control; the relationship between AI and work.) Secondly, she studies how techno-capitalism has created a psychosphere, affecting our perception (our five senses) and experience (cognitive functions) for citizens: the instrumentalization of our brains to the system's benefit: effects on our affective and social behaviour; changes in our relationship in terms of desire and pleasure: changes in communal values. Without question, here is an impactful and vital work in understanding the very nature of the power whose grasp holds us in place.

Narcocapitalism, platform capitalism, surveillance capitalism, neurocapitalism; the labels never end and create a dystopian palimpsest which Guardiola analyses in detail, pointing out the systemic aspirations of power and its desire to exercise a political, economic, cognitive, and affective control over its citizens.

Ingrid Guardiola (Girona, 1980) holds a PhD in Humanities from Pompeu Fabra University. She is an essayist, audiovisual creator and cultural researcher. Her work in cultural institutions and university teaching has focused on the interplay between culture, technology and society, paying particular attention to issues of inequality and gender. She has served on various cultural advisory bodies and was director of Bòlit, Girona's Centre for Contemporary Art,

from 2021 to 2025—a role she combined with regular media contributions and teaching on the Bachelor's Degree in Cultural Communication at the University of Girona's Faculty of Arts.

The correlation between these two phenomena opens up a space for critical reflection, but also business opportunities for the economic elites. Why are we seeing such a spectacular proliferation of non-profit foundations across the globe? Why are companies dedicating so many resources to charitable organizations which they themselves have founded? Perhaps humanity has accepted the task of working towards fairness and solidarity? The truth, unfortunately, speaks of a capitalism which has discovered that poverty is a highly lucrative prospect, and that philanthropy can be a source of income for global financial markets.

The cynical strategy of transforming charity into business is what we call philanthrocapitalism. This book dismounts the narrative woven by these philanthrocapitalists while exploring their rather complex web of donors, corporations, foundations, and governments who amplify profit margins as well as their share of power.

Philantrocapitalism, the latest face of global capitalism's shifting guise, is the cynical strategy of transforming charity into business. This book explores how the financial elites have created an altruistic façade to exploit the inequalities in the system, all while influencing public policy and scoring record profits.



Our author steers us through ideological clashes, two world wars, decolonization, political propaganda, mass media, and the emergence of a global entertainment market, not to mention all those hopes, fears, and struggles of the citizens: all this unrest climbed onto their bikes and rode alongside this turning wheel of history. In one way or another, cycling events headlined episodes which defined an era: the Dreyfus Affair, the independence of Ireland, the Spanish Second Republic and Civil War, the combat against colonialism, the creation of the European Community, the Cold War, May '68, Italy's Years of Lead, or the fall of the Iron Curtain.

In forty chapters this book journeys through forty stages covering the whole of the last century, and proving that a cyclist's chronicle is a music box, echoing historic events and forging an iron-clad metaphor for human existence.

A forty-stop tour that travels through the 20th century, mapping the geopolitical history of the bicycle: a delight for cycling and history lovers alike.

From April 1939 to February 1981, Spain lived through 40 years of a fascist dictatorship, a coup d'état and a problematical (and not yet fully resolved) transition to democracy. Four decades that were made possible by the regime's repressive character and its institutionalisation of power which would concern and model all spheres of social life.

The first part of this book centres on the systematic utilisation of violence and coercion that characterised Francoism from the end of the Civil War up until the dictator's death in 1975 (in bed, by natural causes). The second part analyses the creation of a legal, juridical, economic, and symbolic framework which kept the regime in step with the times and matched reality with the dictator's ideology. The author also champions those who resisted and opposed the regime militarily (the Maguis militia), socially (especially students), and politically (in particular, the Workers' Party for Marxist Unification). Finally, the last part covers the transition period towards democracy, rattled by Tejero's coup d'état, and limited by historical setbacks as well as concessions and balancing acts, which even today continue to generate debate and critical studies auestioning the true extent of change by inferring a cosmetic process carried out by the Establishment.

An erudite and accessible book that explains how 40 years of fascist dictatorship were made possible in Spain (by analysing in detail the regime's repressive strategy, especially in Catalonia, and Francoism's institutionalisation) while detailing the darker side of the transition to democracy, which continues to stir debate and hostility today.

Pelai Pagès (Sant Pere Pescador, 1949) holds a PhD in History and is a professor of Contemporary History at the University of Barcelona. He specialises in labour movements, particularly during the years of the Second Republic and the Spanish Civil War. He is co-editor of the international Civil War journal Ebre 38, and coordinated El Temps d'Història from 2002 to 2005. He has published nearly 300 articles in academic and popular-interest journals.





LITERATURE TRANSLATION

Translation of works originally written in Catalan or Occitan (in its Aranese variant): fiction, poetry, plays, comics and scholarly works (non-fiction and humanities).

Recipients: Publishers.

ILLUSTRATED BOOKS

Grants for the publication abroad of illustrated books by illustrators settled in Catalonia or the Balearic Islands. It includes works commissioned by foreign publishers; the acquisition of published books; international co-editions.

Recipients: Publishers.

LITERATURE PROMOTION

Grants for activities aimed at promoting Catalan and Aranese literature and illustrated works worldwide, including participation in international literary events, book tours, promotional plans as well as monographic issues in literary magazines.

Recipients: Publishers, literary magazines and literary events organisers.

PUBLISHING PRODUCTION

Grants for the production of translations of original literary works in Catalan and Occitan (in the Aranese variant) in the following categories: poetry and theatre.

Recipients: Publishers.

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Grants for translators working on the translation of works originally written in Catalan for residency programmes in Catalonia lasting from two to six weeks.

Recipients: Translators.

PROGRAMME FOR TRANSLATORS

Programme for the translation of excerpts and the creation of materials to promote worldwide the work of modern classics authors of Catalan and Aranese literature.

Recipients: Translators.

PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS

Grants for the creation of materials used in the promotion of Catalan works abroad (translation of samples; production of monographic dossiers on authors; creation of book trailers, researching and translating press, and so on).

Recipients: Catalan publishers and literary agencies.

AUTHORS' MOBILITY

Grants for the authors' mobility of Catalan and Aranese literature outside the linguistic domain of both languages.

Recipients: Catalan writers, illustrators, translators, moderators and experts.

Llull Fellowship

Every year, Institut Ramon Llull organises its fellowship aimed at international publishers and agents. This takes place in Barcelona in September, during the Setmana del Llibre en Català (Catalan Book Week Festival).

HISTORY

First launched in 2007, when Catalan Culture was Guest of Honour at the Frankfurt Book Fair, the project was designed to foster the translation of Catalan works into other languages and the introduction of these books to new markets. Since then, over 200 professionals from 40 countries have participated in this fellowship.

GOAL

The programme aims to provide participants with a more in-depth perspective on Catalan literature and the Catalan publishing sector and to build networks among Catalan and international publishing houses and literary agencies. IRL will cover accommodation and all the costs related to the programme (travel to Barcelona not included).

APPLICATION DATES

Call for applications for 2025 are closed. The dates for next year's edition are not yet published. Updates can be found on our website <u>llull.cat</u>.

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


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
