


Our author has gathered and edited four brief essays into one organic whole which outlines the project on a rather peculiar history of Catalonia, and one which takes into account the facts (shed of any symbolism in the service of a cause) and aspires to answer an important question: why does Catalonia always lose? Gaziel is one of Europe's most pertinent chroniclers from the beginning of the 20th century and a hallmark of Catalan and Spanish journalism. From his exile to France during the Civil War and, later on, enduring an intimate exile with his return to Spain during the Second World War, Gaziel takes an honest and critical look devoid of any triumphalism, leaving propaganda behind to face all evidence of defeat head on. The book is harsh. corrosive, awkward, revelatory and brilliant. A ruthless mirror stands before us. Here is a lucid and occasionally painful self-portrait.

Here are four brief studies conceived as a single essay on a rather peculiar history of Catalonia. In our author's words: 'I would like a history of Catalonia which ceases once and for all to tell the tale of what it should have been and did not become, and tells us instead what it has been and is, to find out if, finally, we can see what it actually could be.'

Agustí Calvet, 'Gaziel' (Sant Feliu de Guíxols, 1887 — Barcelona, 1964) was a journalist and writer. In 1914, he wrote a diary about the outbreak of the Great War from Paris, where he studied and later worked as a war reporter for *La Vanguardia*. From 1920, he was the paper's editor, for some 15 years. He was considered the most influential voice of the Catalan liberal bourgeoisie. He published numerous articles on European politics and relations

between Catalonia and Spain. After his death, his figure was forgotten — his life and work were insightful and honest and uncomfortable for many — but in the last 20 years he's been rediscovered and vindicated as an indisputable classic.

ignasi.moreta@fragmenta.cat Fragmenta Editorial In these two brief hundred-page essays, The Experience of Loss and The Condition of Vulnerability, our author focuses on the crux of his reflection: literary philosophy, an antimetaphysical proposal that eschews absolutisms and embraces the fact of being shelterless. He explores the finiteness of human beings - their elegiac condition - and their ability - starting out from the precarity of inhabiting a body - to generate an answer to existence. Here's a philosophy inspired by Schopenhauer and Nietzsche, as well as post-structuralist thinkers (Foucault, Levinas, Derrida, Butler) and the grand corpus of Western writing (from Sophocles to Virginia Woolf.)

This line of questioning is undertaken with sensitivity, pays close attention to language and its poetic dimension, advances with a complicit tone, and brings together an evocative chorus of voices. Throughout these two books, our author applies this unsystematic system of thinking to two vital and formative experiences: grief – the loss of a loved-one – and vulnerability – an existential condition and origin of an entire branch of ethics.

The easiest gateway into Joan Carles Mèlich's proposal, literary philosophy, which awarded him the National Essay Award. His reflection throughout these essays apply to two key existential categories: grief and vulnerability.

Joan-Carles Mèlich (Barcelona, 1961) holds a Doctorate in Philosophy and Literature from the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona, where he teaches Philosophy of Education. He has written numerous essays on philosophy, ethics and pedagogy. He has developed an anthropological philosophy of finitude in its various expressions. He has also reflected on the witness as a key

figure in any educational relationship, studying the accounts of survivors of Nazi extermination camps such as Primo Levi, Elie Wiesel and Jorge Semprún. He has directed Fragmenta's Biblioteca de Pensament Contemporani collection since its creation in 2021. His essay *The Fragility of the World* won the 2022 National Essay Prize.



Biologist, journalist, essayist, and novelist, in this book Martí Domínguez has found the perfect setting for all his knowledge to shine: Nature's awakening through art. Here is a literary essay proposing a walk down the history of painting and its efforts to capture the world around us; from Giotto's portrayal of a lamb to Gauguin's Polynesian women; from Italian Renaissance painting to the Flemish; and over to the Romantics and Impressionists. The author reflects on art's capacity for imitation and symbolism, and on different conceptions of the material world and human nature inspiring fervour in both life and artists' brushes. Here's a book uncovering a new history of art in rich and elegant prose.

Martí Domínguez (Madrid, 1966) holds a PhD in Biology and is a lecturer in Journalism at the Universitat de València. In 2007 he received the National Journalism Award for his work as editor of the scientific journal Mètode. He has written various novels, among them Mater (Proa Prize in 2002), The Spirit of the Times (Òmnium Prize in 2019), and an award-winning historical trilogy on several figures of the Enlightenment, namely Buffon, Goethe and

Voltaire. In *The Harvest* (2015), winner of the 2016 Catalan Critics' Prize for Narrative, he reflects on the violence and impunity during Franco's regime. His essay *Lucretius' Dream* won the Carles Rahola Prize in 2013.



Our narrator has bought a ruin for a house there and goes on to explain the logistical challenges of moving with a husband and children while discussing life outside of the capital, the passing of time, maternity, the country's spiritual drift, and the need to find a place of resistance. As such, the biography opens up to include arguments on land management, capitalist exploitation, the clash between globalisation and millennial clocktowers, or the dangers that a drought-afflicted landscape - the hard lands - may awaken in an inexperienced eye and a restless soul. Here is a reflection on the identity woven by family and society written in concise and poignant prose and offering enlightening passages.

A tale about the journey back to the land of childhood that forms a reflection on personal and collective identity. A vital — and narrative — process that shines a light on the annihilation of one's origins, yet also the possibility of a genuine and personal rebeginning.

Anna Punsoda (Concabella, 1985) is a writer, translator and editor. She has degrees in Journalism from the Universitat Ramon Llull and Philosophy from the Universitat de Barcelona. She has published the novel *The Beds of Others* (winner of the Roc Boronat Prize) and the essay *Lust*. Among the authors she has translated from German are Rilke, Kafka and Lou Andreas-

Salomé. Since 2020, she has been the editor of the *Dialogal* journal, a role she combines with teaching and translation activities.



Parisian life has become stifling, and photography's explosion onto the scene questions the very purpose of painting. Picasso decides to flee on a journey of self-discovery in Gósol, a tiny, remote village in the middle of the Pyrenees. In this harsh world of smugglers and strong-handed women, our painter falls under an elusive muse's and a Romanic Virgin Mary's spell. Here he shall become Pau of Gósol and set out on shaping the next artistic revolution: Les demoiselles d'Avignon and the eruption of Cubism. On returning to Paris, he goes straight back to finishing Gertrude Stein's portrait and Picasso is finally ready to become Picasso.

In complete creative crisis, the painter disappears into the Pyrenees mountains. Two months later, Picasso has outlined the Cubist revolution and is ready to live out his own legend. What took place in Gósol? Here is a novel-like chronicle covering one of the most relevant and unknown stories in art history.

Iñaki Rubio (Barcelona, 1974) graduated in Humanities from the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona before working as a high-school language, literature, psychology and sociology teacher for many years. Now, he works at the Andorran Ministry of Education as a pedagogy expert in the Cultural and Educational Activities Department. He also writes for the Diari d'Andorra newspaper, is a founding member of Col·lectiu

Portella, and edits the magazine *Portella. Andorra, lletres, arts* and is part of the Andorran National Commission for UNESCO. Rubio is a first-class author, widely recognised and awarded for his short stories and non-fiction work.

Translated into ten languages, her books are read both at university and in the street. This is a philosophy which diagnoses our contemporary malaise and spurs on readers to act. In this latest book, she takes the concept of promise to delve deeper into the project of the Enlightenment, that is, emancipation, temporality, and the possibility of imagining the future. We live in a society that shakes terrified under the shadow of tomorrow, obsessed with predicting, controlling, and planning. Yet, who dares, nowadays, to promise anything? Garcés examines promise-making's historical, philosophical, and literary representation and its current fragility. The act of promising, or so Garcés defends, vindicates the power of words and specifies the link between oneself, others, and the world. Giving our word is a way of reminding ourselves that, despite everything, the future is what we make of it.

Garcés delves deeper into her reflection on the *posthuman condition* in an essay on the power of words and their emancipatory potential to project a promising future.

Marina Garcés (Barcelona, 1973) is a philosopher, activist, and teacher whose work focuses on politics, critical thinking, and pedagogy. She is a widely translated author of several philosophical essays appealing to commitment and action. Her book New Radical Enlightenment was awarded the Ciutat de Barcelona prize of Essay. She oversees and teaches the master's

on Philosophy for Contemporary Challenges at the Universitat Oberta de Catalunya. She contributes to TV and radio shows and has been a member of the academic board of the Independent Studies Program of the Museum of Contemporary Art of Barcelona (MACBA).



Book after book, his line of inquiry has been generated by the poetic power of writing, while drawing on a rich dialogue with tradition: with the Presocratics and Plato's Dialogues; Christianity and mystics like Silesius; with poets like Hölderlin and Celan; with thinkers like Simone Weil, Adorno, Agamben, or Foucault; as well as accomplices like Heidegger, Patočka or Levinas. In this latest book, inspired by spiritual and soul-healing exercises by classical, medieval, and contemporary thinkers like Pierre Hadot, Esquirol applies his philosophy of proximity to the educational and school arena. Here is an invitation to build yourself side-by-side with others and become a constructive world force.

Here is a reflection on school and education seen through the lens of a philosophy of proximity: 'A house exists because so too does the storm. And the storm asks for shelter. School exists because so too does the world. And the world asks for attention. Home and school exist because, in shelter and attention, everyone can move forward and mature, yield fruit. What manner of fruit? One of greater home and greater world'.

Josep Maria Esquirol (Sant Joan de Mediona, 1963) is a philosopher, essayist and professor of philosophy at the Universitat de Barcelona. He directs the Aporia Research Group, whose field of study is contemporary philosophy and, specifically, the relationship between philosophy and psychiatry. He is the author of several recognised books which shape his philosophical proposal. His essay *The Intimate Resistance* (2015)

won the Ciutat de Barcelona Prize and the National Essay Prize from the Spanish Ministry of Culture. His works have been translated into Italian, Portuguese, English and German.

Ciutat de Barcelona Literature Award, 2023 Somewhere between memoirs and autofiction, halfway between poetic prose and philosophical speculation, our author recreates and explores in literature the very centre of the world: Priorat, a rural county in mainland Catalonia, a wine-making land made of stone-built villages and ancient archaeological dig sites, now threatened by the drought, tourists, and forgetting along with other contemporary plagues. Here is a book which dwells on the link between the place where a person lives, their horizon, and those around them. Roser Vernet investigates, probes, and questions this microcosm, bringing us to the conclusion that some roots run too deep to be measured. The act of writing - and the pleasure of finding the perfect word - may just be one of the few resources we have at our disposal to gauge both our and the Earth's depths.

An intimate and equally poetic literary essay on identity and belonging.

Roser Vernet (El Masroig, 1955) is a philologist and social and cultural activist, who stood out in the local anti-nuclear struggle at the end of the Franco regime. From 1977 to 1984 she lived in exile in France and Belgium. Over the years, she has been involved in different territorial defence organisations. She is also the director of the Quim Soler

Centre in El Molar, on literature, wine and the promotion of the writer's work. She is also the former coordinator of Prioritat, the association advocating for UNESCO recognition of the region. She was awarded the Creu de Sant Jordi Award in 2018.

By doing so, she offers an itinerary analysing critical moments in which thinking and the academy have both tested their limits, such as the remodelling of the humanities in the wake of May 1968, or the logic of a neoliberal system that has embedded business into education. Here is an account of moments of resistance against society's disciplinary impulses which unfolds in the form of an intellectual history. Thinkers like Barthes, Lacan, Deleuze, Foucault and Bourdieu are called on to guestion more deeply the concrete challenges of today such as segregation and bureaucratization of education, or the role of the humanities (in particular literature) in current school curriculums.

An essay about the relationship between literary theory and educational centres that contemplates educational institutions' controlling tendencies and the freeing potential of literature. A story that also offers a passionate route spanning the ideas of some of the 20th century's most influential thinkers.


Ester Pino Estivill (Barcelona, 1980) holds a Doctorate in Literary Theory and Comparative Literature from the Universitat de Barcelona. She has taught literature at various secondary and higher education institutions in Barcelona, Lyon and Paris. She is currently an Associate Professor of Literary Studies at the Universitat de Barcelona

and an Associate Professor in the Master of Humanities at the Universitat Oberta de Catalunya. Her main fields of study are the poetics of modernity and the circulation and uses of literary theory, subjects on which she has published several articles in specialist journals. Here are 1,500 pages dedicated to an author obsessed by posteriority - he commissioned up to four biographies in his lifetime - that seeks to discover the 'real I' behind the 'literary I' woven over six decades of obstinate dedication to writing and literature of the self. Xavier Pla (Girona, 1966) is a Professor of Contemporary Catalan Literature at the Universitat de Girona, where he holds the Josep Pla Chair in Literature and Journalism. He obtained a doctorate in Comparative Literature from the Sorbonne Université of Paris in 1996. He has published studies on authors such as Joan Sales, Mercè Rodoreda, Marcel Proust, Jorge

Semprún and Claudio Magris. A specialist in Josep Pla, his essay Josep Pla, Autobiographical Fiction and Literary Truth won him the 1998 Serra d'Or Prize. He has also edited the original Catalan manuscript of two historical essays by Josep Pla. In 2015 he was awarded the Catalan Government's National Culture Prize.



Grants

LITERATURE TRANSLATION

Grants for the translation of Catalan literature, including fiction, poetry, plays, graphic novels and scholarly works (non-fiction and the humanities).

Recipients: Publishers.

LITERATURE PROMOTION

Grants for activities aimed at promoting Catalan and Aranese literature abroad, including participation in international literary events and promotional plans focused on illustrated works.

Recipients: Publishers and literary events organisers.

ILLUSTRATED BOOKS

Grants for the publication abroad of illustrated books by illustrators settled in Catalonia or the Balearic Islands.

Recipients: Publishers.

PUBLISHING PRODUCTION

Grants for the production of translations of original literary works in Catalan and Occitan (in the Aranese variant) in the following categories: poetry and theatre.

Recipients: Publishers.

PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS

Grants for the creation of materials used in the promotion of Catalan works abroad.

Recipients: Catalan publishers and literary agencies.

TRANSLATORS IN RESIDENCY

Grants for translators working on translations from Catalan to stay in Catalonia for two to six weeks.

PROGRAMME FOR TRANSLATORS

Programme for the translation of excerpts and the creation of materials to promote abroad the work of literary modern classics in Catalan and Aranese.

Recipients: Translators.

AUTHORS' MOBILITY

Grants for the authors' mobility of Catalan and Aranese literature outside the linguistic domain of both languages.

Recipients: Catalan writers, illustrators, translators, moderators and experts.

Llull Fellowship

Every year, Institut Ramon Llull organises its fellowship aimed at international publishers and agents. This takes place in Barcelona in September, during the Setmana del Llibre en Català (Catalan Book Week Festival).

HISTORY

First launched in 2007, when Catalan Culture was Guest of Honour at the Frankfurt Book Fair, the project was designed to foster the translation of Catalan works into other languages and the introduction of these books to new markets. Since then, over 200 professionals from 45 countries have participated in this fellowship.

GOAL

The programme aims to provide participants with a more in-depth perspective on Catalan literature and the Catalan publishing sector and to build networks among Catalan and international publishing houses and literary agencies.

IRL will cover accommodation and all the costs related to the programme (travel to Barcelona not included).
